

## Cognizant Donates Tablets and Laptops Worth INR 1.53 Crores to Government Schools in Maharashtra



### *Partners with Nirmaan Organization to aid digital skills and learning*

Cognizant has donated 865 tablets and 40 internet-enabled laptops to government schools in Mumbai and Pune as part of the nationwide “Digital Schools” initiative of Cognizant Outreach, the company’s employee-led volunteering programme and one of India’s largest corporate volunteering efforts. Nirmaan Organization is the implementation partner in this initiative.

Cognizant Outreach’s “Digital Schools” project is being implemented in four phases and will impact over 3700 students and over 180 teachers of government schools across six states in India. Cognizant is contributing over INR 6.7 crores for the initiative.

The devices were presented to the schools at a function held at New English School, Phursungi, Pune. The event was attended virtually by Mr. Sandeep Rane, Vice President and Head of Pune Operations at Cognizant, Mr. Abhishek Jain, Associate Director, Cognizant Outreach and Mr. Mayur Patnala, CEO, Nirmaan Organization. This initiative will benefit over 860 students of classes 9 and 10 and over 40 teachers of government schools in the region. Cognizant has contributed over INR 1.53 crores towards procuring these devices.

Cognizant Outreach and Nirmaan volunteers will conduct programs to train the students on using the equipment effectively and will also monitor usage to ensure positive educational outcomes. Volunteers will also conduct training sessions for faculty members to empower them with digital skills and techniques to enhance student engagement and learning outcomes.

Speaking at the event, Mr. Sandeep Rane of Cognizant said, “As an organization that believes in the power of education to enable social progress and transformation, Cognizant will continue to serve the cause of digital inclusion in education. The “Digital Schools” initiative is our effort to ensure that rural schools that serve underprivileged communities overcome the extraordinary disruptions and digital inequalities brought about by the Covid-19 pandemic and continue imparting education.
